A father-daughter road trip set in 1990s Poland, *Treasure* follows Ruth (Lena Dunham), an American music journalist, and her father, Edek (Stephen Fry), a charmingly stubborn Holocaust survivor, on a journey to his homeland. While Ruth is eager to make sense of her family's past, Edek embarks on the trip with his own agenda. This emotional, funny culture clash of two New Yorkers exploring post-socialist Poland is a powerful example of how reconnecting with family and the past can be an unexpected treasure.

Following the film there will be a short Q&A with the film's director **Julia von Heinz** and **Lily Brett**, author of *Too Many Men*, from which the film was adapted.
